

Quizzing Lingo

Quizmaster – The person in charge of a quiz. He/she asks the questions, determines if a quizzier is right or wrong, and runs the quiz.

Cadence – The speed at which the quizmaster reads the questions.

Regular Question – The type of question that is most prominent in a quiz. Asks a Who/What/When/Where/Why/How question directly from the scripture material.

Specialty Question – A memory or reference question.

- a. Memory Question: A question that asks you to quote or complete a certain number of verses word perfect.
- b. Reference question: A question that provides a chapter and/or verse in addition to a question.

Jumping Speed – How many words of the question you hear before you jump.

Word Perfect – Quoting the scripture word for word, exactly how it found in the NIV scripture portion.

Thought Perfect – Quoting material with different wording than is found in the Scripture portion, but maintaining the meaning of the Scripture.

Contest – When a quizzier believes that a quizmaster has made a mistake in how he ruled, a quizzier can contest the quizmaster's decision by standing up and saying "I would like to contest".

Keyword – The word of a question at which the question is distinct from all others.
